Financial Aid Check Distribution Calendar Spring 2009

Financial aid checks are mailed on the dates listed below. **(Note: You must notify the Registrar and Office of Student Financial Services immediately of any change in your mailing address). The Bursar's Office reserves the right to collect tuition from the first source of financial aid available. This schedule may change due to circumstances beyond our control. Students are strongly encouraged to arrange Direct Deposit of their funds into a savings or checking account. Contact the Bursar's Office for further details.**

- *Federal Direct Loan Program Checks*

Wednesday, February 4th, 2009. (The first expected disbursement date for new Direct Loan borrowers and those who applied in January 2009 and after will be March 04, 2009 or on a subsequent disbursement date.)

- *SEEK (Search for Education, Elevation, and Knowledge) Book Advances*

Wednesday, February 4th, 2009

- *FSEOG (Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant Program) Checks*

Wednesday, February 4th, 2009

- *Federal Perkins Loan Checks*

Wednesday, February 4th, 2009: Perkins Loan regulations require all students awarded a Federal Perkins loan to complete a promissory note each year. The website is <https://www.ecsi.net/promF5>

- *Federal Pell Checks (First Disbursement) & ACG / SMART Checks*

Wednesday, March 4th, 2009: Note: This first disbursement is 50% of the total Pell award minus tuition and any book voucher purchases.

- *Federal Pell Checks (Second Disbursement)*

Wednesday, March 25th, 2009 This is the remaining 50% of the total Federal Pell award less any tuition or book voucher still owed.

- *Federal Work - Study Checks*

The Office of Student Financial Services publishes a separate Federal Work-Study Schedule which includes time sheet due dates and check mailing dates.

Students who officially withdraw from all classes or stop attending before they have completed 60% of the semester may owe a repayment of Federal Student Aid, tuition, or a book voucher.
